SILICA CRYSTALLINE - QUARTZ:	The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has classified occupational exposures to respirable (\leftarrow 5 um) crystalline silica as being carcinogenic to humans . This classification is based on what IARC considered sufficient evidence from epidemio-logical studies of humans for the carcinogenicity of inhaled silica in the forms of quaM and cristobalite. Crystalline silica is also known to cause silicosis, a non-cancerous lung disease. Intermittent exposure produces; focal fibrosis, (pneumoconiosis), cough, dyspnoea, liver tumours.		
1,2-BENZISOTHIAZOLINE-3-ONE:	Acute toxicity data show that 1,2-benzisothiazoline-3-one (BIT) is moderately toxic by the oral and dermal routes but that this chemical is a severe eye irritant.
